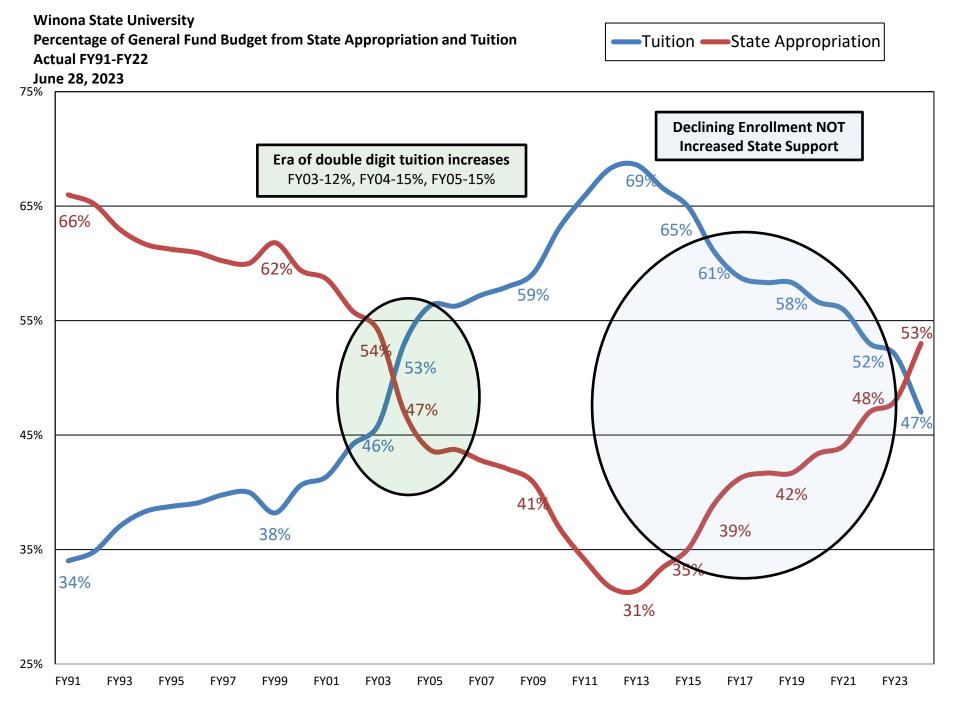

Summary of Higher Education Bill



- Other Items (WSU Share Subject to Mn State interpretation and allocation)
 - IRAP employer contribution change \$40k?
 - Unemployment insurance \$40k?
 - Student support services (Mental Health, etc) \$150k?
 - Equipment and learning environments \$300k?
 - Free menstrual products \$25k
 - Workforce development scholarships (2 yrs schools?)
 - Industry sector programming ??
 - North Star Promise (Starting in FY25, free college \$80k family income or less)
 - OHE will establish program in FY24 for rollout in FY25
 - Should be a good match for our first gen and other populations

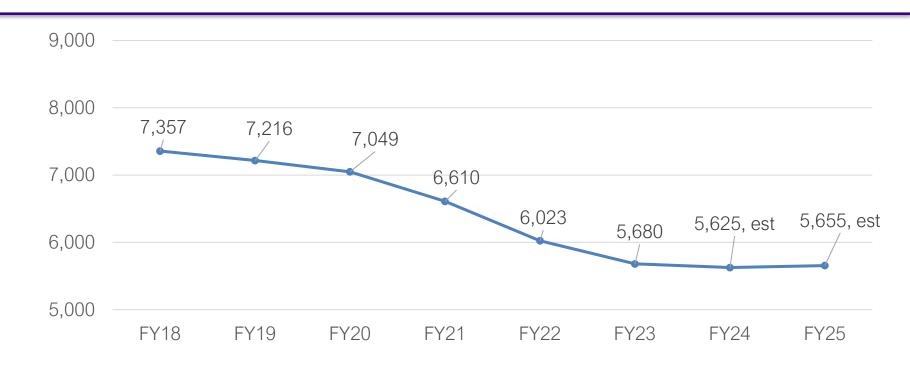

Enrollment – Summer and Fall 2023

- Summer enrollment -1.3% or 6 students from last year
- Fall Enrollment Targets(budget based on):
 - New Entering Freshman: 1,225 (1,214 in 2022)
 - New Entering Transfer: 400 (374 in 2022)
- As of June 23rd:
 - New Entering Freshman Registrations 1,185+ (More to come)
 - New Entering Transfer 300+ (Typically register in July/August)
 - Continue to work hard towards the enrollment goals for 2023

Total FYE (Full Year Equivalent) Enrollment





Enrollment Change

FY18 to FY23: -1,677 or -22.7%

FY22 to FY23: -343 FYE or -5.6%

FY23 to FY24: -55 FYE or -1.0%



FY24/25 Budget Update

Collective Bargaining Update



- Tentative agreements with AFSCME and MAPE reached last week
 - 5.5% + step progression FY24
 - 4.5% + step progression FY25
 - Other details to follow
 - Contract must be ratified by members
 - Law change this session: No longer requires Legislative approval

Negotiations ongoing with IFO, ASF and other bargaining units

Where are we? – FY24 Budget



- Budget deficit in FY24 (\$1.7M) will have to be solved with fund balance and carryforward funds
 - Will continue to monitor enrollment and ongoing bargaining settlements for changes that will impact the current year budget (FY24)
 - Cabinet will be cautious on filling of positions
- Fund balance will be below the 20% Mn State threshold
 - Current estimate for EOY FY23 is 15-16%
 - Mn State is watching and monitoring
 - Once budget is balanced, will have to rebuild this fund balance above 20%
- We need as much carryforward as possible
 - Carryforward comes from salary savings due to unfilled positions, unspent operating budgets, etc
 - Annually about \$2M is realized from carryforward

Where are we? – FY25 Budget



- Probable \$8M+ budget deficit for FY25
- Items that could help this number:
 - Legislative support through a supplemental budget request
 - Increase in enrollment
 - Contract settlements less than anticipated
 - Inflation cools off dramatically
- Items that could hurt this number:
 - Recession / Decrease in legislative support
 - Decrease in enrollment
 - Contract settlements higher than 4%

Where are we? – FY25 Budget



- Administration will continue to refine budget scenarios over the Summer as additional information is received
- August/September meet and confer cycle with bargaining units to discuss budget
- Interim President Janz and the President's Cabinet will be engaged in conversations across campus this Fall around the budget

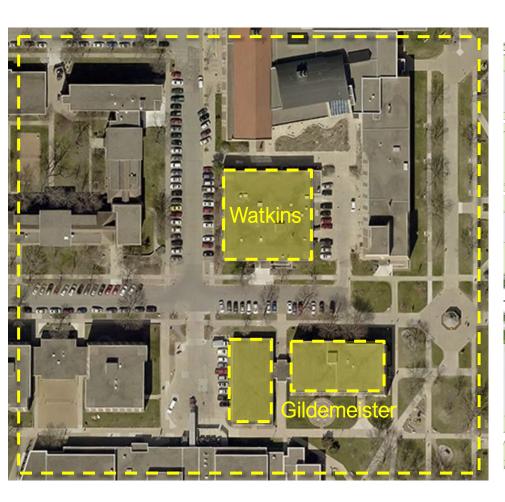

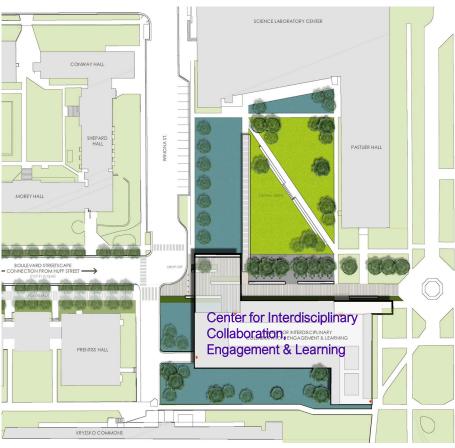


- Center for Interdisciplinary, Collaboration, Engagement & Learning (CICEL)
 - Home to Computer Science, Math, Art and Design and other student services
 - First Net Zero Energy Building in Mn State System
- Received design funding in 2023 legislative session \$4.8M
- Construction funding request is #4 on 2024 Mn State bonding list about \$67M

HEAPR



- HEAPR = Higher Education Asset Preservation and Renewal
 - Funds infrastructure items:
 - Roofs
 - Heating and Air Conditioning (HVAC)
 - Plumbing
 - Electrical
- MnState received \$45M in 2023 Legislative session
- WSU share will be \$2.7M and project is Memorial Hall Roof
