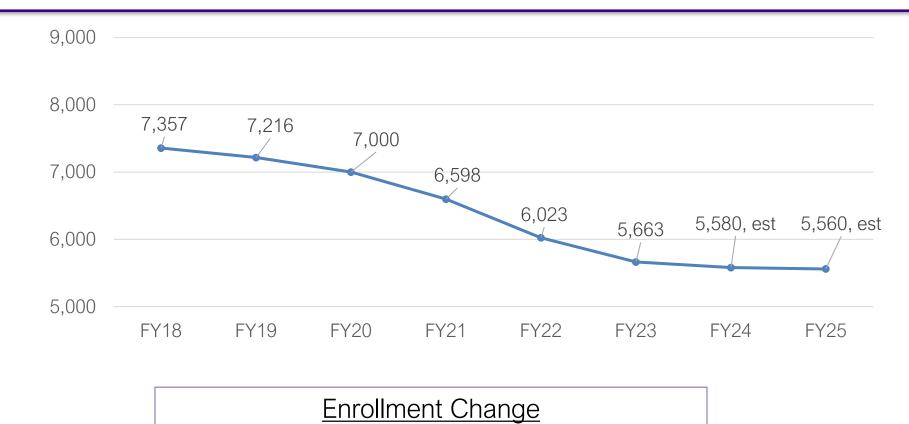


- State Appropriation Change

Enrollment



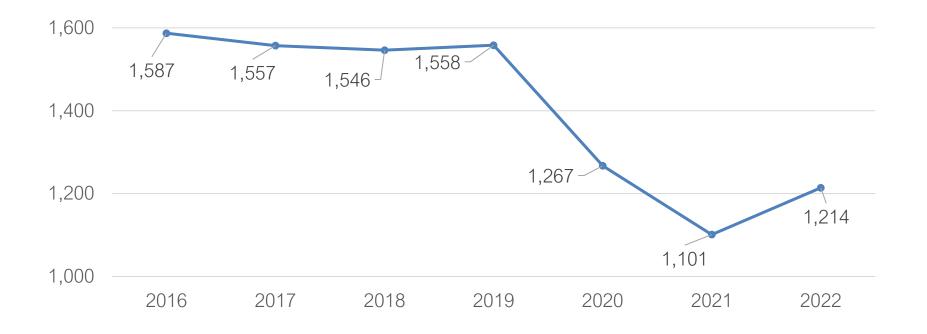


FY22 to FY23: -360 FYE or -5.9%

New Entering Freshman Enrollment





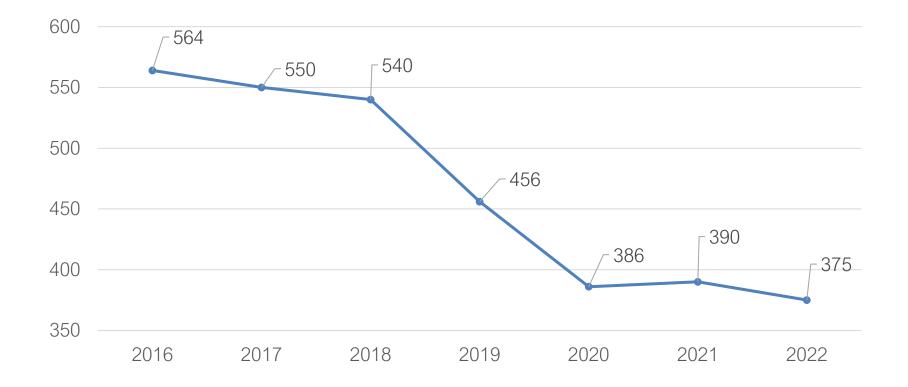
NEF Change

2020 to 2021: -166 or -13.1%

2021 to 2022: +113 or +10.2%

New Entering Transfers Enrollment







- Targets(budget based on):
 - New Entering Freshman: 1,225 (1,214 in 2022)
 - New Entering Transfer: 400 (374 in 2022)



FY23 Budget Update

Budget Update – FY23



- \$4.4M of base budget reductions have been determined
- Supplemental funding from Legislature did not pass
 - \$750,000 included in budget estimate will have to be factored into FY24 budget planning
- FY23 enrollment adjustment
 - Spring 2022 projection was for 5,760 New estimate is 5,663
 - Decline of 97 or about \$775,000 in tuition revenue
- University will be frugal on position replacements and other expenses in an attempt to generate as much budget savings to help offset the \$1.5M in FY23



FY24/25 Revenue Budget





- State budget surplus as of February 2022 is \$9 billion
 - Total State budget is about \$54B
 - Largest ever recorded Typical surplus is \$1B-2B
- Revenues as of October are \$2.9 billion over February 2022 estimates
 - Minnesota's economic consultant now forecasts a recession for 4th Quarter 2022 and first two quarters of 2023
- State economic forecasts
 - December 6th, 2022
 - February 2023

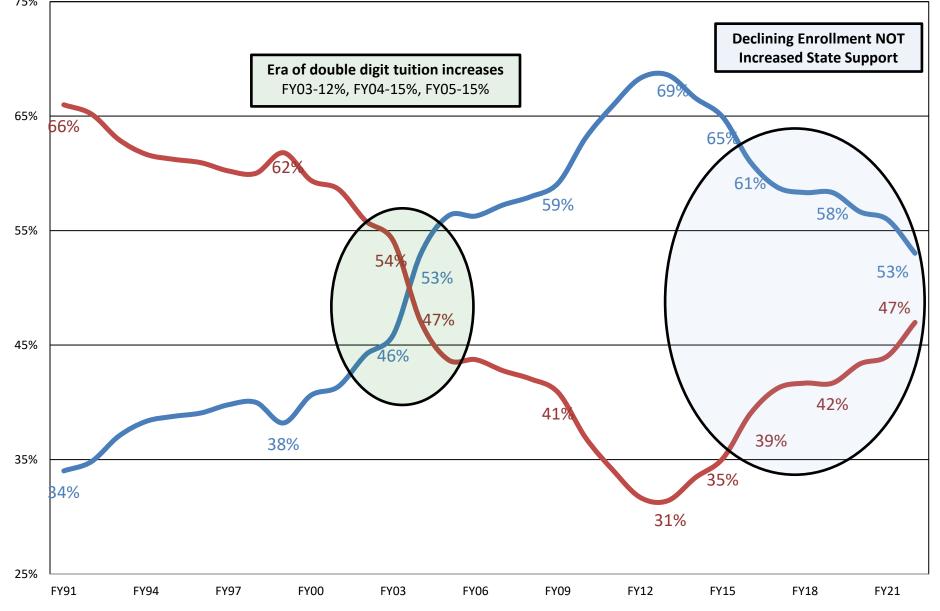

- Assumption within biennial budget request is a 3.5% increase
- Higher if tuition freeze is not funded?

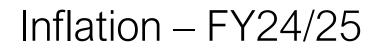


FY24/25 Expense Budget

Salary and Fringe Settlements – FY24/25



- Collective bargaining units have yet to begin negotiations on a new contract covering FY24/25
 - Mayo Clinic +6% for staff employees
- Largest part of our budget (70-75%)
- Historical data would tell us range seems to be 3% to 7%
 - Comparing past settlements to inflation rates





- Inflation remains high CPI +7.7% YoY
 - Highest CPI rate in 40 years
 - Has been trending lower Peak was 9+%
- WSU Impacts
 - Chartwells Food Service: + 9%
 - Travel(Athletics, Professional Development, etc): +20% or more
 - Utilities: +20-30%
- Fund all the cost increases or pass them on?



- Not planning on a BESI offering in FY24 and beyond
- Administrator travel budget has been eliminated for FY23
- Holding firm on salary savings
- Cabinet review of all position replacements
