- Chair Reports
 - Academic Affairs
- Whereas, students enrolled in winter term coursework pay for winter term fees in addition to spring term fees,

Whereas, paying for winter as well as spring term fees is unsustainable and infeasible for students,

Whereas, many students do not stay on campus during winter term and therefore do not utilize campus services,

Whereas, Winona State offers reduced fee rates for summer term classes,

Whereas, per Winona State's current policy, students residing 35 miles away or more from Winona State campuses qualify for reduced summer term fees,

Therefore be it resolved, WSUSS recommends implementing a Reduced Student Fee Request that matches that of the summer term for 2024 Winter Term courses school year and beyond.

Moved by: Academic Affairs

- Chair Hermerding: It was brought forward to me that winter fees were an
 issue. We went back to the old winter fee motion that was written last
 year and changed it. We decided to have a fill out form on warrior space
 saying you are this many miles away and taking a class during this term.
 This can let the university know that you are taking a class and do not
 need the fees to be added
- Chair Hossain: There is no separate semester for this. I had concerns. If this winter term is combined with the spring term, then why are we being charged these extra fees? I do not get all the fees I am paying for. I think this is a great motion and has people thinking about this.
- Senator Howarth: I am in favor of this motion. I do live in the cities and I have never done a winter course but have done a summer course. I do think we should pay when we are not on campus. I think it will be more beneficial to students on campus to have those utilities they can have
- Senator Galvin: I took a winter course this last winter for my major. I
 know people who live far away that shouldn't have to pay for it.
 Question for the Chair. What exactly are the fees that are getting
 reduced?

- Chair Hermerding: good question, don't know the complete answer
- O President Carman: From my understanding any fee that is charged is what we are trying to reduce with the winter term. The IWC you aren't able to utilize that. I don't know every fee that is charged in the winter but there are some. All fees that you normally get are charged, in the summer you get reduced fee but it is not an option in the winter which is what we are trying to reduce
- Senator Kurth: Ideally we want every fee reduced but we would like it like the summer fees. If you are away from campus you get a reduced fee. That was the thought process and having it match up with summer classes
- Chair Hermerding: I had a fee waiver that took 305.62 off.
- Senator DeLuca: This is a question for a Chair and could be an amendment. Can we make it more clear to make it similar to the summer term. Would you consider this a friendly amendment? "Reduced Student Fee Request that matches that of the summer term"

- Chair Hossain: Mention a few fees. Winter wellness fee, union fee, health service fee, technology fee. There are a lot. They are a small amount of money that adds up to a large amount of money and that adds up for students. For students I think this a great motion for students and anyone on campus.



- o SAF Account Balance: \$78,909.11
 - Currently sitting at this. We are no longer sitting at a higher position than last year
- SAF Account Balance after approval of Consent Agenda: \$75,243.54
- SAF Account Balance after approval of Unfinished Business: \$74,493.54
- Senate Account Balance: \$1,400.12
- SFMC recommends a 5.9% increase to the Health Services Fee
 - Presentation
 - Budget
- They requested this increase. We have a link to the presentation as well as the proposed budget. They are currently at a negative and are hoping for an increase to dig them out of this. This is where you are painting for a service if you need to get lab work this is where you would get it
- President Carman: It will be good to look at this prior to the meeting and will be talking about it next week
- Speaker List
 - Senator Peil: Covid was a pretty big factor and ever since then they have been negative. This would be getting them out of this just in case something else were to happen to them. Sometimes there are outbreaks on campus and this can go to students to get them vaccines and will prevent an epidemic on campus. We did not think a \$5 increase would be the end of the world
 - Senator Grams: As the speakers touched on, they have \$-92,000. This is to help lessen that burden and we can help them climb out of that debt that they are in
 - Senator Galvin: question for treasurer: current health
 - Treasurer O'Connor: If you look in the green box area you can see the per rate currently you are paying.
 - Senator Howarth: Looking at the numbers I am in favor of this. Everyone gets sick around the fall, I go to the Health and Wellness and can get the flu shot and everything we need. It can give the health and wellness center more support because not many students use it. It is \$5 extra and this is a beneficial area to be taken care of. Health and mental wellness is important.
 - Senator Peil: As a graduate student, only taking 6 credits so fees are cut in half. I keep in mind most students are paying full fees. Employees were also laid off

because of this. They would be seeing the same amount of students every year.

Regardless of how many students enrolled. The service does not see an increase or decrease in students using this

■ Senator Abagat: In general I think we are in approval of this budget. This specific budget is one of the biggest things we are in support of. Otherwise as a Nursing student as public health safety, I am in full support of this.

Whereas, Mental Health is an issue that WSU is passionate about,

Whereas, Mental Health First Aid would allow WSU to be better equipped to assist with Mental Health crises,

Whereas, WSU is able to provide a Mental Health First Aid class for \$25 per student with a maximum of 30 Students,
