Whereas, menstrual equity is important to the students at Winona State University,

Whereas, WSU students deserve access to menstrual products,

Whereas, there are limited stores in walking distance to buy menstrual products at an affordable price,

Whereas, gender neutral bathrooms are the most equitable space for those who menstruate to receive the products,

Whereas, the Student Union has agreed to keep menstrual products stocked in all five gender- neutral

bathrooms of Kryzsko Commons,

Whereas, Aunt Flow's dispensers allow for more accessible use of the dispensers compared to the current ones,

Whereas, cartridge pads cost \$125.00 for the initial stock,

Whereas, cartridge applicator tampons cost \$125.00 for the initial stock,

Whereas, five model pad/tampon dispensers cost \$1,000.00 total,

Whereas, shipping is \$105.00,

Therefore, be it resolved, WSUSS allocates \$1,355.00 from the SAF to George Micalone and the Student

Union for the cost of the Aunt Flow dispensers, initial stock of products, and shipping.

Whereas, Winona State Student Senate recommended a 0% tuition increase for all students at Winona State,

Whereas, many students pay for part of their tuition themselves and go into debt doing so,

Whereas, students have other payments that factor into their lifestyles on top of their tuition,

Whereas, over the past 10 years, on average, tuition has increased by 2.04% every year at WSU,

Whereas, students were impacted by the previous increase in the 2022-2023 academic year,

Whereas, the Minnesota Legislature may enact a tuition freeze in the coming weeks,

- Sen. Eichele- having this funding limitation sets a precedent so the majority of organizations understand request limits, bylaws can always be suspended, good baseline

NEW AMMENDMENT (Weber, Wright)

No more than 15 people requesting funds for one trip (does not include other people going on the trip)

No more than a maximum amount of \$750 \$500 per person for the entirety of the trip including all travel expenses (i.e. airfare, lodging, food, transportation, registration costs, ect.)

DISCUSSION ON AMMENDMENT

- Sen. Wescott- can anyone remind me when a really large group came and asked for a very small amount of money
- Sen. O'Connor- supports amendment, music conference was amount per student was less than \$500
- Chair Schiro- numbers do not make sense for this amendment, do not agree with this amendment
- Treas. Rieken- open to opinions on this, agree on changing, focused on the wrong thing slightly, it is the issue of how much we give per person, focus on attention to bottom two lines
- Sen. Minich- we should ammend third line this time
- Sen. Wescott- kept the third line, added a clause about larger groups be open to consideration, talking in circles a bit, keep previous and add a small clause about larger groups being taken into consideration
- Sen. Weber- why i don't like the number 15, i feel like senate is intimidating to present in front of, could turn people away, we need to be accessible
- Sen. Hermerding- how many students will know and or read about these bylaws
- Pres. M. Olson- this will be included in treasurer workshops and ASO meetings
- Sen. Eichele- fine with getting rid of this top line, agree with a lot of things that are being said, if we support this amendment, love to see to put in amendment chang in amount so we don't have a 22.5 amount of person from the total amount
