- Sen. Weber- gives information about SAFC to club
- Rep.- Treas. Rieken- has used \$52 out of \$500, do not have to use this but they will communicate this later
- ACS National Conference (specific needs aside from total cost will be listed in powerpoint on teams)

  - 10 students total
  - Presenting individually at conference
  - Good WSU presence
  - Attending lectures at conference that will provide professional development
  - Registration fee and posters that give proof of presentation
  - Listed travel costs for MPLS for parking and airfare
  - Listed lodging costs
  - Gave conference agenda
  - Gave sources of funding and travel grant
  - Total ask: 8288.40
  - Chair Schiro- why are there different costs per person for certain things?
  - Rep.- Some have not registered for flights or booked hotels due to lack of personal funds
  - Chair Schiro- can you tell us who has actually booked things?
  - Rep.- \*listed all
  - Sen. Houssain- is this a club or just a group of students?
  - Rep.- All of these projects have been in the works with professors, similar to capstone, so this is not through a club, have asked chemistry club for funding
  - Chair Jones- so the only thing you would be paying out of pocket is food?
  - Rep.- Out of pocket would be \$200 per person for meals

- Chair Jones- is there anything you are paying for on your own?
- Rep.- Yes, registration, paying \$300 on our own
- Sen. O'Connor- registration fee is included in the total, am I misunderstanding something?
- Rep.- Registration fee is in the total as this is our total representation of expenses not just our breakdown of asking
- Sen. O'Connor- so what is your actual ask?
- Rep.- That number is correct
- Chair Schiro- so the registration fee is included, are you looking to be reimbursed?
- Rep.- Yes
- Chair Schiro- so you would not be paying anything out of pocket
- Rep.- Correct, we are only able to contribute the \$600, due to lack of personal funding
- Chair Jones- any fundraising?
- Rep.- Yes, we are looking to funraise with the chemistry department but they are suffering financially as well. We would like for them to keep their funds, which is why we are reaching out to you first
- Sen. Westcott- if we were unable to grant you full amount, what is the minimum you could accept?
- Rep.- It would be sad if we did not get this full amount as we would not be able to attend this meeting, as many students are not able to, keep in mind this is \$8000 per 10 people, which seems a lot right now
- Sen. Houssain- looking at taxi and uber for group, which is listed individually, could you carpool and bring down the cost?
- Rep.- Put in groups for who was traveling together, many people are traveling at different times due to different flights and lodging
- Sen. Houssain- same flight, different seats, correct?
- Rep.- Some are flying in on saturday and some are sunday so we are not all traveling on the same day, taxi and uber would be to travel in groups for eating, for five total days,
- Sen. Houssain- why is the registration cost different for each person?

- Rep.- Varies slightly due to ACS member status, SciFinder posters are extremely important because you need proof of presentation at conference, so this is mentioned as a max of \$200, so math is incorrect
- Sen. Houssain- did you reach out to any other organizations for funding?
- Rep.- Yes, chemistry department, requesting money for student senate first before we go to them
- Sen. Abagat- have you thought about hosting a fundraising event?
- Rep.- As full time college students, it is extremely difficult to coordinate, we are all from the same school but doing individual projects at different labs, requesting as a group to save time on senate's behalf because they are all individual projects,
- Sen. Abagat- are meals provided by conference or are you eating nearby the conference?
- Rep.- Meals are not provided by the conference meeting so it is an estimate for meals throughout the trip
- Sen. Eichele- what is the absolute minimum you could receive? As in the very very least for lodging or airfare
- Rep.- This is the minimum, what we originally started with was \$3000 more
- Sen. Eichele- so if senate would provide \$8000 or \$7000, those would not work for you?
- Rep.- Unfortunately no, we would not be able to attend financially
- Sen. Hermerding- National conference, are you offered anything through this organization?
- Rep.- Not from conference, but we also requested travel grant from Winona State and reached out to conference for lower registration fees, which was accepted, and lowered cost for hotels through the conference
- Sen. Wescott- location?
- Rep.- Indianapolis
- Sen. We scott- if you are allotting for \$200, could that estimate be lowered through grocery shopping, it seems a bit excessive
- Rep.- Not possible, groceries require a kitchen, we could lower it some, we will be eating out for basically every meal which is what we have access to, we will not have time to cook food or grocery shopping, economy is growing
- Sen. Sherchan- senate was your first choice for funding?

- Rep.- Yes, chemistry club and department is "strapped for cash"
- Sen. Sherchan- did chemistry club give you an estimate of what they could contribute?
- Rep.- No
- o Rochester Nursing Club

#### NEW COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Whereas, WSU student workers are currently being paid \$10.59,

Whereas, many places on campus, such as Jack Kane dining, which many students rely on for meals, are short-staffed and close early,

Whereas, students who live on-campus may have to work on campus due to lack of transportation to other jobs,

Whereas, International Students are dependent on on-campus jobs and their off-campus job opportunities are severely limited,

Whereas, \$10.59 is not a competitive wage as it is the minimum wage in Minnesota,

Whereas, this wage does not encourage students to apply for these understaffed on-campus jobs due to the opportunity to earn more money through local businesses who pay higher wages,

Whereas, other Minnesota State schools already have higher wages for their students, such as:

Minnesota State University Mankato: \$12.00 Bemidji State University: \$12.50-\$13.50 Saint Cloud State University: \$10.59-\$12.08 Metropolitan State University: \$12.00

Minnesota State University Moorhead: \$12.00-\$15.00

*Therefore be it resolved,* the WSUSS Student Services committee strongly recommends that Winona State University raise the student worker wage to \$13.00 minimum by the fall semester of 2023 to be more competitive and comparable to other Minnesota State schools, and local Winona businesses, to encourage students to work on campus.

#### DISCUSSION ON RECOMMENDATION:

- Sen. Hermerding- speaks in support, explains how this would be helpful for students that work on campus to afford more immediate costs
- Sen. Houssain- totally supports motion, considering other school's wages, some jobs allow to work on homework other jobs such as chartwells you are tired at the end of the day, especially as an international student, would love to have better pay on campus

- Sen. Westcott- supports motion, lucky to have second or third jobs quit due to competitive wage on campus, wants that for other students and support local campus business
- Sen. Eichele- talks about other universities comparable wages, as well as gives students a deeper sense of community and quality of life
- Sen. Sherchan- is this passes, would this affect students that work for chartwells?
- Pres. M. Olson- this would be exclusive to winona state, chartwells and bookstore are independent and set their own wage
- Sen. Houssain- all students could be supported by this, not just international
- Sen. Eichele- if there are jobs that pay higher on campus and are available, students will logically be drawn to higher paying jobs, Chartwells might consider raising their minimum wage, so this motion could impact this greatly, even for those independent entities
