Whereas, safety is a priority at Winona State University,

Whereas, cup covers will provide protection to the drinks of students whenever they feel they need extra protection,

Whereas. Night CapTM provides cup covers with scrunchies and keychains.

Whereas, 100 cup covers will have scrunchies and 100 will be keychains,

Whereas, the cup covers cost \$4.75 each,

Whereas, Sigma Tau Gamma will sponsor the event and provide \$125,

Therefore be it resolved, WSUSS allocates \$825 from the SAF to be transferred to the Student Senate Internal Account to pay for cup covers.

Sen. Wright- since we are a dry campus, we do not allow alcohol unless special circumstances, condoms are not inductive of anything prohibitedon campus, better to just "watch your drink"

Sen. Houssain- we care about our students, want our students to be better safe than sorry, people might get distracted

Sen. Carman-voice support for this, understand concerns, people still do it, some are uneducated, still happens all the time even when we know what to do, can be anybody, don't see a problem as it is sad of what we have to do, what would be an alternative?

Sen. Brandon- good idea, not specifically for our campus, better way to protect students would be to give out info, having 200 does not protect all students, if you want on eo bad, just purchase one

Sen. Wescott- students are going to drink anyways, can be something that students remember for years to come, touring campuses and seeing safety is a big deal for enrollment, good to teach about drugs but not effective enough

Sen. Eichele- an analogy is cooking, better to have materials to stop fire than fire marshal saying "you should have been more careful"

Sen. Weber- look at history of cup covers, they indicate drinking and alcohol, students already given alcoholic training

Sen. Palmerton- only getting 200 is not ideal, still supports, people are going to do it anyway, should do as much as we can to promote safety

Sen. Curtin- also doing education things along with this cup covers, freshman do zone out of mandatory training

Chair Schiro- this is a form of protection, talked to family about protective device and they invested for other family members, would hate to look back on this as a senate and see we did nothing when we could do something

Sen. Hermerding- think about how you are speaking, wording can be taken differently


Sen. O'Connor- supports motion, protect students in all situations

DISCUSSION ON AMMENDMENT

- Chair Schiro- wages would decrease if the percent increase is left at 0%
- Pres. M. Olson- they *might*
- Sen. O'Connor- same building we use for all meetings, many of our events, show it off on tours, should support it
- Sen. Wright- point made last week, when we discuss fees, every department will be impacted, there are some fees we should prioritize increase,

DISCUSSION ON AMMENDMENT TO THE AMMENDMENT

- Sen. Kurth- supports, some services not justified right now, paying for reoccurring expenses that are not used
- Pres. M. Olson- clarification, once fee is increased, George can choose how money is used, we do
 not dictate that
- Chair Schiro- not in favor of amendment, 1% will not do anything, passed increases with less information, we have a very detailed presentation and now we want to pick on this more
- Sen. O'Connor- speaks against amendment, this amount does not cover, as a point it is required to staff fire feature
- Sen. Weber- 1% is not adequate, as some presentations give a range, this one did not
- Sen. Carman- talking about fees last year, it almost has to be an all of nothing, give full amount they ask for
- Chair Schiro- even if a small increase, that is still a huge jump.

DISCUSSION ON AMMENDMENT

- Sen. Kurth- with clarification, I am in support of this fee increase
- Sen. Sherchan- when recommended 0%, how did you come to that conclusion
- Treas. Rieken- a vote, many opinions, I did not vote so I cannot give opinion
- Sen. O'Connor- SFMC member, discussion was had, one vote away

- Sen. Houssain- even though it is an increase, I would be happy to pay for these improvements in Kryszko, fire feature could have more use with more staffing, whatever money we invest, we want something we can utilitze
- Sen. Carman- not allowed to use below 32 degrees, utilitze for beginning of the year, towards end of the year, that is the reason for less usage this time of year
- Sen. Palmerton- I struggle with it is all laid out how money will be used, but it is not a guarantee
- Pres. M. Olson- clarification, there were unrealistic issues with the meditation room, not purposeful neglect
- Sen. Weber- a lot of people come in with a lot less than George did, came in with good
 presentation, was respectful to students, did a lot more than the majority of the bodies asking for a
 fee increase
- Sen. Wright- not in support, recent years has already put forth funds to student union, students have already put money towards these things
