

- Sen. O'Connor-speaks in support of committee recommendation

DISCUSSION ON RECOMMENDATION

- Sen. We scott- we should reflect on this tuition increase, as state government should be pauying a portion but we have not, maybe this is an unnecessary increase, advocating for what our students want
- Chair Carman- seconded recommendation, wanted to facilitate discussion, personally do not want to pay more, should not be a student burden, should be a state issue rather than a student issue.
- Sen. Peterson- do not like that they are compensating low tuition numbers with more tuition payment, which is unfair

- Sen. Sherchan- supports motion
- Sen. Wright- we should be talking to other students and getting their opinion, don't forget to talk to constituents
