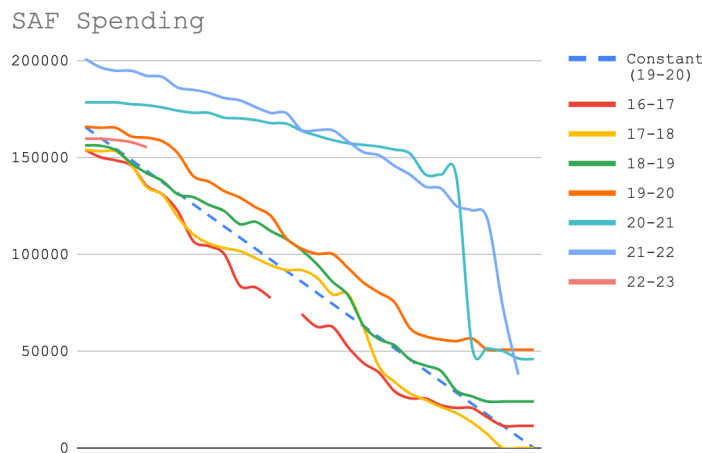

- Chair Schiro- we have other speakers that are requesting money that don't get full amount,
- Sen. Eichele- choose to give amount in red, money will be given back to senate, it does not seem like it hurts
- Sen. Roers- amount in red makes sense, don't want to make habit of giving more money than asking, if need more, can come back and request, would like to see them come and request again

- NEW MOTION:

Whereas, a Cricut Explore Air 2 is a device to cut out digital designs onto material,

Whereas, a Cricut machine would allow for more efficient and intricate posters or bulletin boards to be made,

Whereas, having a Cricut machine in the Student Senate office of Kryzsko 109 would make it available for officers of clubs to schedule and use the device for bulletin board making,

Whereas, a Cricut machine would draw students into the Student Senate office and develop closer relationships between Student Senate and club/organization members,

Whereas, students who use the device would have instructions laid out for them on how to operate it and would be required to bring their own materials and clean their space after use,

Whereas, the Cricut device would stay in the Student Senate office at all times and would benefit the future student body by being passed down for years to come,

Whereas, a lilac-colored Cricut machine would match the purple colors of Winona State University,

Therefore be it resolved, WSUSS allocates \$250 from the SAF to Tracy Rahim to purchase a Cricut Explore Air 2 machine and the required mats needed for usage.

Therefore be it further resolved, any remaining funding will be returned to the SAF as soon as possible.

 - Clubs struggle to make boards look the best as possible, as a resident assistant who has used this machine before, it seems like having a cricut would help with driving traffic and connect clubs and senators, library has cricut which shows the need for one, am in support for this
- Seconded by: Senator McCuskey
 - Senate and club leaders together, more campus involvement opportunities, constant issue is how difficult it is to advertise through PR, a cricut would alleviate stress to make good designs and professional designs, cricuts are used in housing and residence life, develop advertisement
- Chair Schiro- if the library has one, why do we need one?

- Sen. Eichele- available to anyone, while that's great, this motion will give us and clubs a more private use and limits traffic, professional to have a separate one
- Chair Shiro- who would be in charge of this?
 - Sen. Eichele- office is a public place, what if someone would steal it? Think about the other items we have in our office and how our worries are not on the theft of those. If equipment goes bad, it's rare but it will be
- Chair Schiro- as a membership for cricut, will we be getting one?
 - Sen. Eichele- as a resident assistant, I have not paid anything and I do not plan on it.
- Chair Schiro- would we provide supplies?
 - Sen. Eichele- it is encouraged to bring materials except mats and device as bare minimum, library will have materials
- Sen. Roers- concern of library use before our own purchase, concerns of commodity for students
 - Sen. Carman- yield in redundancy
- Sen. Wright- good idea to drive traffic, if bringing own materials, we just provide the machine, confusion as to use
- Sen. Weber- maintenance, who is in charge of maintenance, who's in charge of replacement costs, could bite us in the end
- Sen. Palmerton- would we be the ones to teach them how to use it? Troubleshooting
 - Sen. Eichele- don't expect people to know how to use cricut, up to those who know how to use it, there's a laid out instruction manual in the motion, how to generally use it, in experience there is not much needed
 - Dir. Endresen- if clubs using for display cases, clubs have to supply all materials, can use SAFC money, slide from library discussing cricut- clubs have access and students with materials except in large quantities
- Sen. Wescott- as a previous Resident Assistant, it can be temperamental, can be hard for those who haven't used it, housing has a premium account it will be very limited, can add own things, very limited access.
- Sen. Abagat- clubs can sign up, how can we do that?

- Sen. Eichele- pictured, but open to suggestion, sign up sheet next to cricut to come and view list for hour long blocks, next to instructions list on a first come first serve basis
- Sen. Abagat- who will regulate this?
 - Sen. Eichele- can make a template online, print out, have that available that can swap out
- Sen. Abagat- support this, to hear that the library has this, would like to wait on this to see if it is effective before we initiate
- Sen. Carman- after hearing all thoughts about this, will only be using this once a year, this would make sense to use the one in the library, we should hold off to see how to library
- Sen. Brandon- just got one in the library, no experience with it yet, newer ones are finicky, once a year thing, library is a better option, question: will we be responsible to fix it?
 - Sen. Eichele- Depends on the damage we're talking about, if intentional or large amounts could be asked to fund, smaller maintenance could be done from senate, all tech has faults but
- Sen. Brandon- people are coming in and using it, it's a distraction if we're trying to get stuff done, don't know why they're there entirely.
