The goal of the proposed changes is to update, diversify and streamline the WPT minor, while also making it more accessible to students:

- (1) replace SOC 430 with a choice between POLS 130 and POLS 225 in the required courses
- (2) add and eliminate electives which are/are not currently germane to the WPT program

According to the Program Coordinator for the Sociology Department, regular teaching of SOC 430 (Political Sociology) will likely be discontinued in the near future; additionally, SOC 430 has a prerequisite, which raises the effective required number of S.H. for the minor to 21, rather than 18. POLS 130 (International Relations) and POLS 225 (Ethnic Conflict and Nationalism) are taught more regularly, and are taken by larger numbers of students than SOC 430, would make the WPT program more easily accessible to more interested students.

These courses have clear, direct, and significant relevance to the WPT minor. In an interdisciplinary program such as WPT, normative coursework in PHIL 140 (Intro to War, Peace, and Terrorism) and PHIL 341 (The Just War Tradition) needs to be supplemented by multiple social science perspectives on the causes and nature of political conflict. POLS 130 and POLS 255 enable students to focus their core empirical coursework on international or subnational conflict, and the remaining electives ensure students maximal freedom to select courses that focus more closely on particular wars, or on particular kinds of violence and conflict, or on the general relationship between law, order, peace, and the use of force.
